On Monday, June 20, community members and dignitaries came together for a flag raising ceremony held in Tiny Township to highlight **National Indigenous Peoples Day**. In cooperation with Indigenous organizations, the Government of Canada chose June 21, the summer solstice, for National Aboriginal Day, now known as National Indigenous Peoples Day. For generations, many Indigenous peoples and communities have celebrated their culture and heritage on or near this day due to the significance of the summer solstice as the longest day of the year.

Tay Shore Trail Rules Reminder

Take a walk along the Tay Shore Trail with Senior Municipal Law Enforcement Officer Harry Horn and his BFF Maverick as they remind us about some of the key rules along the trail this time of year. Click to watch the video below!

General Rules of Etiquette:

- Expect and respect other trail users.
- Stay on the trail! Respect neighbouring landowners by staying off private property.
- Take only pictures leave only footprints and leave the trail as you found it.
- Please place garbage in the receptacles provided - help to keep the trail clean.
- Keep to the right to allow other users to pass on your left.
- Wheels give way to heels please be mindful of users who are going at a slower pace than you.
- Maintain control of your pets. Dogs must be leashed at all times.
- Stoop and Scoop is mandatory!
- Use extra caution at access points and yield to traffic when crossing roads.
- Avoid making excessive noise.
- Obey all posted regulatory signs. Use trails only according to the permitted uses indicated on the signage, pursuant to Township By-law.



 Motorized vehicles including but not limited to snowmobiles, dirt bikes, ATVs, and power assisted bicycles (E-bikes) are NOT permitted on the trail.

The survey is open to all residents, stakeholders and community members. 2022 Municipal Election

The 2022 Municipal Election will take place **Monday October 24**.

Voting – Tay electors will have the option of electronic voting using either Internet or Telephone. In addition to Internet/Telephone, a Paper Ballot Vote option will be offered ONLY on



Election Day.

Tay Township will also be voting at large meaning that voters can vote for all positions of Council. The Ward system has been eliminated.

Are you on the Voters List?



The voters' list is a list of eligible electors in Tay Township.

The Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) is responsible for collecting the information of residents in Ontario (name, date of birth, citizenship and school support) in order to create a Preliminary List of Electors for municipal and school board elections.

This helps to ensure that the municipality

has the most accurate information possible for the 2022 Municipal and School Board Elections. To make sure you are on the list and your information is accurate, visit voterlookup.ca to register, confirm details and update any information that may not be current.

Boat Launch Parking Permit

A permit is required to park with a trailer in the trailer parking spaces located at 110 and 145 Albert Street.

Obtain your parking permit instantly online at MyTay.ca. Click on "Boat Launch Parking Permits" and enter the required information.

Please note that you will need to provide proof of property ownership or residency, and provide the license plate number of the vehicle the permit will be attached too.



A reminder that trailer parking at 110 and 145 Albert Street is permitted at the following times (and requires a Municipal Parking Permit).

Monday to Friday from 5:30 p.m. - 11:00 p.m.

Saturday 1:00 p.m. - 11:00 p.m.

Sunday 5:00 a.m. - 11:00 p.m. (May 1 to Oct 15)
