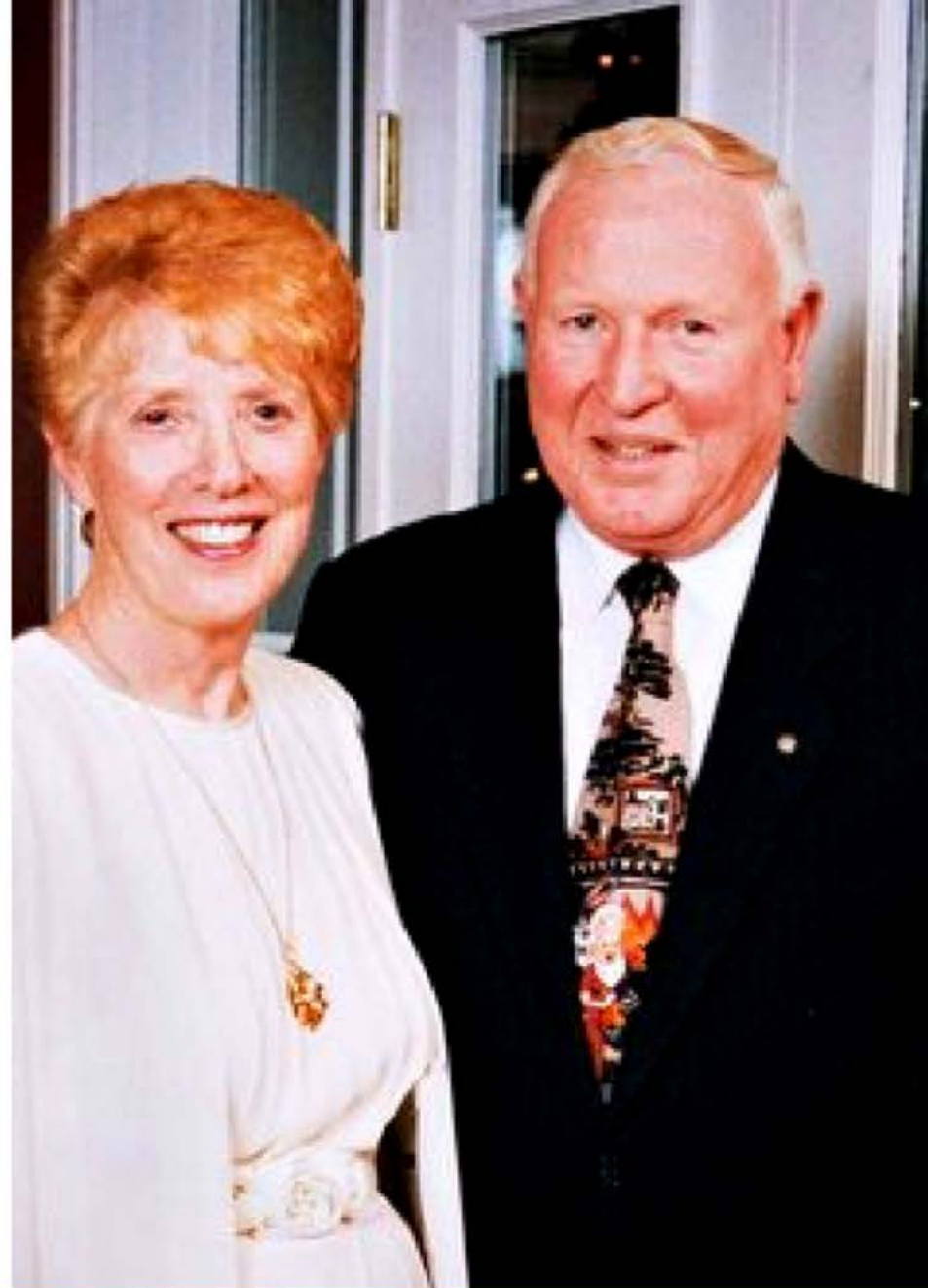

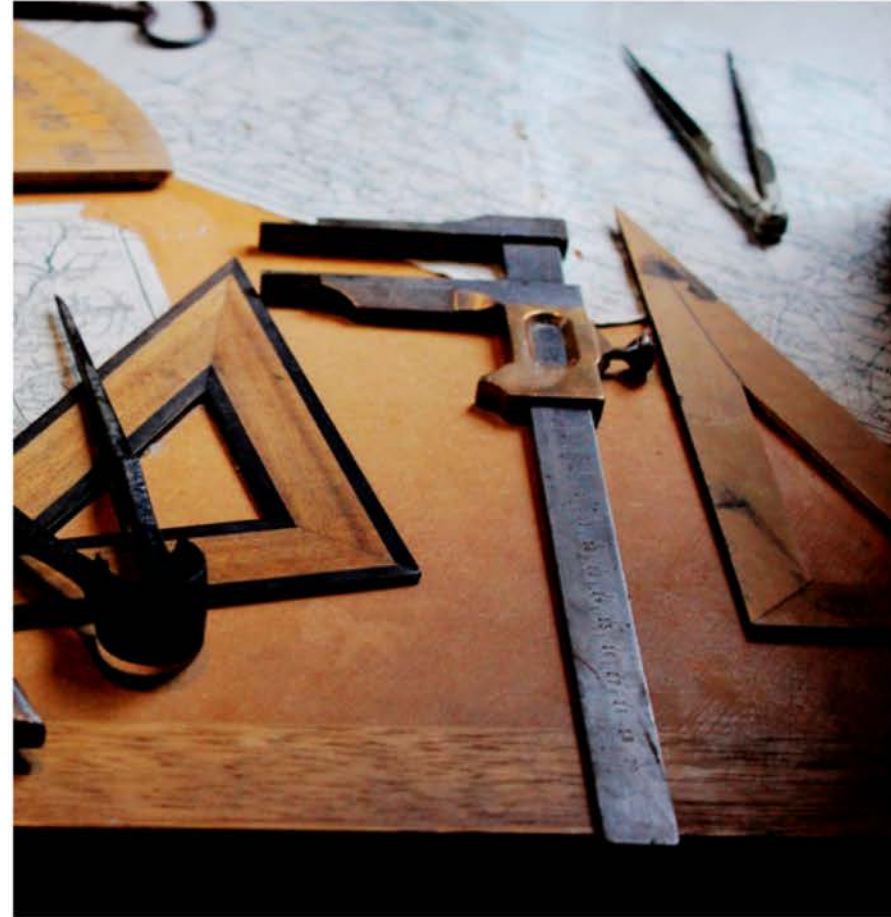


# Why Rebuild?

- There has been an increase in the level of care required by our Residents.
- As the population continues to age, the number of seniors will increase two-fold. Long Term Care and Retirement Homes will double in numbers over the next 20 years.

## **The new Villa Care Centre will enable a more comprehensive service offering:**

- **Long Term Care Plus:** Bariatrics, Dialysis, Behaviour, Vents (Provided Appropriate Funding)
- **Short Term Care:** Rehab
- **End of Life Care**



# Continuum Of Care

The Villa re-development will be a multi-phase project.

- **1st Phase:** A 128-bed Long Term Care Home, along with Corporate Offices, a wellness hub, and classroom and lab space.
- **2nd Phase:** A 140-unit Retirement Home, which will be the home of close to 170 residents.
- **3rd Phase:** 90 Senior Housing units with supportive services in place.
- **4th Phase:** When the market is ready, the expansion of the Long Term Care Home.





# Centre Of Excellence

- In tandem with the re-development of The Villa Care Centre, Jarlette Health Services looks forward to launching the Centre of Excellence.
- This centrally-located nucleus will benefit both Jarlette Residents, as well as the local community.
- It will aim to provide inclusive care as close to home as possible, and give patients access to a single specialty team with expertise in seniors' health.

Frail seniors hurdling obstacles in their journey to receive health care will soon catch a break.

Dr. Kevin Young, an Orillia geriatrician, is physician lead on a North Simcoe Muskoka-wide plan to improve and streamline services for the region's elderly. He said that right now, the system is very fragmented.

"People that are getting services find that they have to travel from one place to another. They often have to figure out what's out there on their own. They have to tell their story multiple times. There's not a lot of sharing of information from one group to another and not a lot of co-ordination in the system," Young said.
